

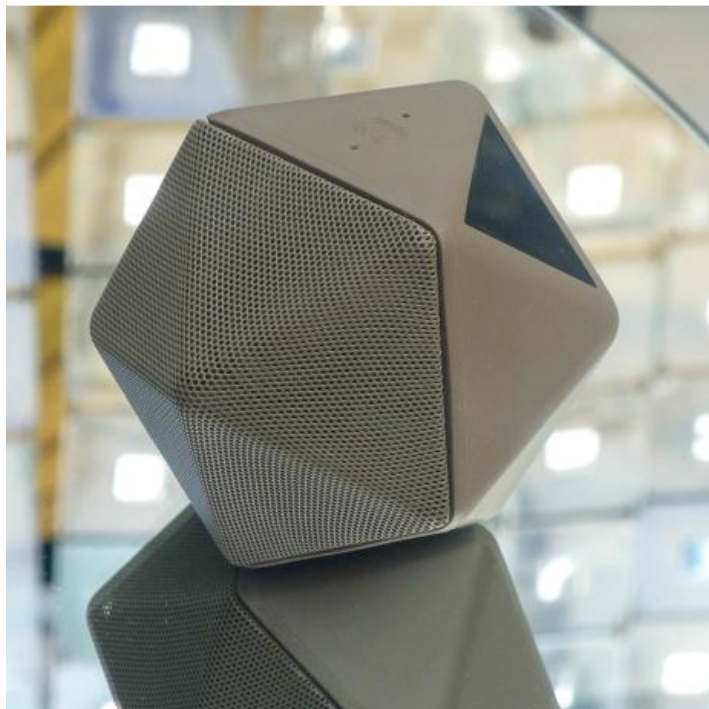

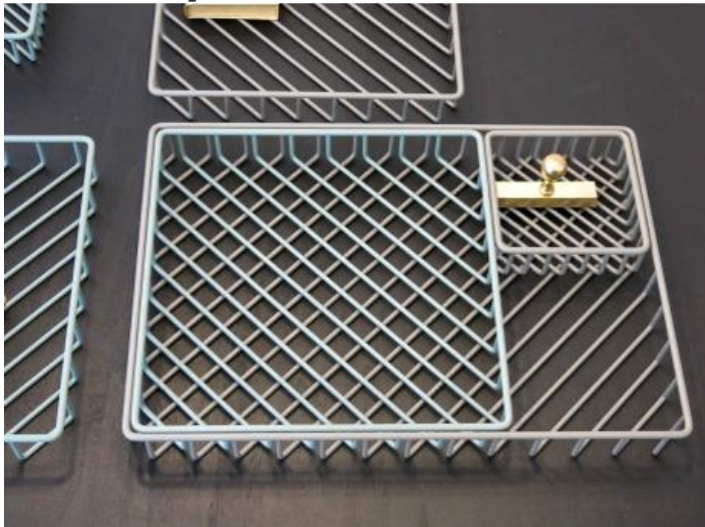


J. Hills Standard at Milan Design Week 2014
